A critical element to the success of our plan is to have the financial resources readily available to fund a response. BLA is the first, and quite possibly the only, line of defense in the case of an AIS infestation. We have been exploring our options in the case of an infestation and the cost is substantial.

Fisheries Report

August 13-17, 2018 Fish Sampling Birch Lake

The BLA assisted the DNR in their "every 5 years" assessment of the fish in Birch Lake. Both basket style nets and gill nets were used to catch fish to be sampled for growth rate of various fish in



the lake. Many large walleyes and northern pike were caught, measured, and if they were alive, released back into the lake. We truly have a lot of nice size fish scattered around the lake. The number of crappies and walleyes as well as perch have increased slightly over the last sampling 5 years ago. You can check the exact numbers and sizes of fish on the DNR website later this spring.

The DNR also caught and released smaller minnow sized fish in July, Those results will also be available from the DNR. They did this while walking the shores of Birch Lake with a 50 foot seining net.

Walleye stocking of Birch Lake October 3-9, 2018





Approximately 755 pounds of 6-10 inch walleye fingerlings were stocked in Birch Lake this fall. The BLA assisted the DNR's stocking of the fish About 1/3rd of the walleyes were released 3 different days: October 3, 250# at Bay View Resort landing; Oct. 5, 250# at Hydeaway Bay Resort; Oct. 9, 250# at Bay View Resort. The DNR stocks Birch Lake every other year.



The Cass County Board of Commissioners approved the name change of Paquet Lake to Poquet Lake. The information has been forwarded to the State of Minnesota for final approval.

A Little Bit of History by Diane Zaske

Pollution of Birch Lake has been a concern for many years as noted in an article from our history books written by Fred Martin. He speaks of the concerns about lakeshore pollution and states "The city of Hackensack put in its first sewer in 1967. Subsequently, it was found that the sewage disposal plant was inadequate and in 1986, in conjunction

with the two townships (Hiram and Birch) and with funding from various sources, a much larger sewage disposal plant was installed. It included two lagoons and gathering system was extended on around the north shore of Little Birch to include all of the Peaceful Shores plat and thence around the far northeast of Big Birch to the end of development at that time, along Birch Lake Lane. This put much more than half of the dwellings on and adjacent to Birch Lake on a first-rate sewage system."
